UPDATE FROM THE CUBMASTER

Den 8 – Wolf Power of the Air

For their first field trip of the year, our Den 8 Wolf Scouts visited the Flying Cloud Airport to learn about all the cool things we can do with air besides breathing it!

The boys started with a bit of Bernoulli by blowing across the top of a piece of paper (and also introducing a stall by modifying the

paper to lose airflow). That was boring stuff though - they were waiting as best they could before sitting in the cockpit for a photo op and learning about how planes actually work with a close inspection of the tail.

While we couldn't get them in the air, we did the next best thing. After clearing out the hanger by bringing planes to the taxiways, we set up a platform and measured out cones in five-foot increments. The Scouts built



and raced three different styles of paper airplanes. The pinnacle of the evening was when each Scout took their best plane and attached a rubber band to truly catapult it from one end of the hanger to the other! The winner went home with a map of all Minnesota's airports.



Den 10 – Bear

The Bears took part in a candy machine project where the Scouts got to build and stain their creations in a color of their choice. Den 10 also took a trip to MnDOT's Regional Traffic Management Center (RTMC) where the Scouts were able to see a FIRST responder vehicle and take a tour of the control room.
